- Assisted over 150 researchers, some working for weeks at time, in our offices.
- Accessioned over 130 linear feet of new materials.
- Processed over 30 linear feet of existing archival materials, including major work on ephemera collections.
- Kept safe one of the largest collections of GLBT historic materials in the world.



PASSIONATE STRUGGLE

Between November 08 thru October 2009, Passionate Struggle, our temporary exhibit on Castro Street, attracted 25,000 visitors and hosted many special events. For most of the year, it was open seven days a week.

Four exhibits rotated through our downtown galleries, attracting thousands of visitors:
